Our Method

We want to equip people on how to develop, grow and multiply discipleship partnerships and discipleship teams based on the principle that Jesus first equipped the core group of disciples.

Our Way

Our way has no cost in terms of resources. We only use Scripture because it contains the life of God and is the basis of all kingdom growth (John 6:63; 2 Pet. 1:3-4). Our people are taught *Relational Bible Reading* to engage, teach and equip others how to follow Jesus as a Seventh-day Adventist Christian.

Discipleship Principles

1. Discipleship is an invitation to a growing relationship with Jesus Christ with the help of the Holy Spirit (John 17:3; Phil. 3:10). Our walk with Jesus fuels our work for Jesus (Matt. 4:19).
2. Prayer precedes disciple-making and demonstrates our utter dependence upon God (Mark 3:13-15; Col. 4:12). We do not overtly seek a culture of mission but are intentional about a culture of discipleship – the joy of knowing Jesus and leave the outcome to the Holy Spirit.
3. Since discipleship is the catalyst for disciple-making it is the key for leadership development and kingdom growth (John 15:8). A passion for God sparks a passion for the lost (Luke 19:10).
4. Disciple-making is an intentional, Christ-oriented activity to use *every opportunity* in encouraging and teaching others to know, grow and faithfully follow Jesus (2 Tim. 2:2).
5. Disciple-making is a *joyful relational ministry* that comes from knowing Jesus and sharing Him (Matt. 28:19-20).
